

Croft Church of Church of England Primary School – PE Funding Strategy 2017/18

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum in recent years to provide substantial primary school sports funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Department of Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will spend the sport funding on improving their provision of P.E and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they will do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE, swimming or Change4Life programmes
- Paying for additional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions or increasing participation in competitions and the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/Sport
- Providing additional places for pupils on after school clubs, or additional clubs to increase the number of children accessing sport/PE

How will we be spending the sports funding and who will benefit?

- All pupils through PE teaching from PE experts
- All pupils through organised play at break and lunch times
- All pupils in inter-school competitions
- Able pupils in out of school competitions
- Pupils who attend out of school provision will get the opportunity to be taught by PE experts
- Pupils who want to attend out of school clubs in Karate and Zumba
- Pupils with special educational needs to take part in gross motor skills activities
