Other than regularly reviewing the standards in school, progress towards priorities on the School Improvement Plan, many policies and the school budget this term we have:


- Discussed the taking of photographs at school events, the use of images and our duty to safeguard our pupils and staff – the result of this has been shared with parents

Teaching staff are amazing, giving above and beyond and ensuring that the children get the best education they are capable of offering – well done.

As it is a small school staff know the children well. Lots of opportunities to attend the school for celebrations and to see the children's work. Having the opportunity to speak to teachers on the playground at home time is very useful.

Excellent teachers and a great community feel about the school and staff.

Supportive, caring environment with focus on Christian values and pastoral care, encouragement and recognition/praise of achievements, inclusive and accepting.

It is a caring school and all staff and pupils welcomed my daughter into the school. Good values are taught.

It is a nice friendly school with very nice helpful teachers and all staff.

It is a friendly happy school with well mannered, kind children.

Extra-curricular activities provide good wider development opportunities, great teaching standards.

Small size, excellent area, excellent teacher-pupil relationships, great grounds, superb staff, motivated and forward thinking head, supportive parents.

Hard working, enthusiastic, committed staff. I often see the headteacher to speak to or on the yard speaking with other parents and greeting them at the beginning of the day – I think this makes him welcoming to parents. A positive all-inclusive attitude to children of all abilities, this is reflected through the children's interactions with each other.

Christian ethos, encouraging good morals. Staff are caring, dedicated and approachable.

The staff in out of school club are lovely, our children love going there.

Safe environment, good standard of teaching, caring attitude to pupils, Christian Values through whole school.

The Christian focus on values. Individuals allowed to be individuals, they don't need to conform to a certain personality. Great leadership from the head and also the individual class teachers.

Great staff, great teaching and very friendly.

Teachers are great. As a parent I feel included in my child's education.

The behaviour of the children, lots of praise such as the WOW wall, star of the day etc. Also the children are doing really well academically too!

**The table below summarises some areas of concern and what we will do to respond to them.**

<b>What parents have said</b>	<b>What we do now and what we will do as a result of what you have said.</b>
More regular feedback regarding progress. To be informed sooner if their child is having difficulties and more information on how to support their child at home.	<b>We currently</b> have two parents' evenings, one in the Autumn Term and one in the Spring Term. Parents are given a short report card to summarise their child's progress at these meetings. Parents receive a full written report in the summer with the option to come into school to discuss it if they wish. In addition staff hold information evenings to keep parents up to date with the curriculum and assessment. <b>We will</b> introduce an additional written progress report at the end of the Autumn and Spring terms to update parents on their

	<p>child's progress in English and mathematics. If your child seems to be having difficulty, for example with an aspect of their learning, a member of staff will contact you and arrange a meeting to discuss how they can work in partnership with you to support your child.</p>
<p>What are we doing to prepare for Ofsted as it was a long time ago?</p>	<p><b>We have</b> been working very hard to meet the new very much higher standards required by Ofsted, to meet the much higher expectations required of all children and new assessment arrangements. This has required a few changes but most of these are now in place.</p> <p><b>We will</b> continue to review our progress regularly to meet these challenges and feedback from parents is invaluable in this process.</p>
<p>Would like more educational visits.</p>	<p><b>We have</b> one educational visit or visitor into school per class each term. As a small rural school we are geographically quite isolated from places we would like to visit and this has an impact on cost. We need to keep this affordable for all parents and therefore staff choose visits which are high quality learning experiences. We have arranged for some excellent visitors into school and we will continue to look at all options. We have introduced school enterprise days and funds raised from these events are used to subsidise educational visits and other WOW experiences.</p>
<p>Would prefer more notice re trips/events/equipment needed.</p>	<p>We acknowledge this does cause some problems and we are working hard to resolve this. Sometimes we are given very little notice ourselves. <b>We are</b> now putting planned PE activities and competitions in the school newsletter and there PE newsletter produced each term to keep parents better informed.</p> <p><b>We will</b> be sending letters out via email so that they get home faster.</p>
<p>Not sure offering cakes etc. at lunchtime every day encourages a healthy lifestyle</p>	<p>Our school meals are nutritionally analysed to ensure a healthy diet and now incorporate many more vegetables and fruit than before (sometimes hidden)!</p> <p><b>We will</b> be reviewing our Whole School Food Policies in the near future and we will consult with parents when we do.</p>
<p>Concern that changes are communicated post-decision and therefore parent comments, which are stated as being welcomed, are of no consequence.</p>	<p><b>We do</b> consider all parents' comments when making decisions. Sometimes we need to go with a majority if opinion is divided.</p> <p><b>We will</b> set up a parent group next term where parents can come and discuss with staff and Governors any issues or policy changes.</p> <p><b>PLEASE REMEMBER Mr Robson welcomes parents and carers to come in and talk to him about any issues you may have.</b></p>
<p>More PE, sporting activities, particularly for those who are not part of teams and more extracurricular activities for younger children too.</p>	<p><b>Currently</b> all children access 2 hours each week timetabled PE in a variety of different activities. The timetable is included in the weekly newsletter.</p> <p>A PE Newsletter is issued each term.</p> <p>This year we have introduced a specialist sports coach on a weekly basis at lunchtime to work with all children in a variety of physical activities. Mrs Marksby does an excellent job in continuing this programme of activities throughout the week. Our Play Leaders encourage all children to become involved. Lunchtime activities are accessible to all children.</p> <p>A variety of other Clubs such as Netball, Cross Country, Cricket and Football run at different times of the year</p> <p>We continue to offer our very successful Discoverers Club led by Mrs Jones (pupils from Y1 upwards can attend) and Karate on</p>

	<p>Fridays. More activities are planned for the future through Simon Carson Sports School.</p> <p><b>We would like</b> to offer more and are looking into additional activities and sports clubs.</p> <p>We would welcome any assistance with Clubs and if any parents have any skills or talents and would be prepared to help with or run a club we would love to hear from you.</p>
Concerns over the target user for the school's Twitter account.	Our Twitter feed is for parents. Our aim is to provide information on what is happening in school. Online Safety is of the highest priority in school.
Better outdoor learning areas.	We have wonderful grounds around school and a superb Early Years outdoor area. We recognise that we can do more to develop this and are looking at ways of doing so and grants which will fund this.
Traffic management	<p>Traffic is always a problem here as it is for most schools. We have requested the support of the local Police. They will be doing spot checks.</p> <p>Children are now able to come into school from 8.50am which has helped somewhat. We <b>strongly</b> encourage parents to park at the Croft Hotel or Village Hall to ease congestion. <b>We rely on parents to park with due regard to pupil safety and the needs of the local community.</b></p> <p>If anyone has any other suggestions please let us know.</p>
Would like to see some improvements in pastoral care	<p>All staff are available to talk through parental concerns. The pastoral care and safety of children is our highest priority.</p> <p>We have introduced Drawing and Talking, Time to Talk and Socially Speaking in school and staff have received training. We also have a selection of resources and leaflets for parents in school to help direct parents to local services and use in particular times of need.</p>
Separate boy/girl changing facilities	<b>This has been actioned</b> as a result of your comments.
<p><b>School Meals</b></p> <p>Choice. Time to eat meals.</p>	<p><b>We have</b> taken up the issue of choice with County Caterers and have changed menus accordingly. We are introducing a pre-ordering system from September 2017 and this will be trialled before the end of this term. Children are not hurried to eat their meals and we try to maximise the time children have to eat. We will continue to offer parents the opportunity to come into school and try school meals after receiving excellent feedback.</p>

The Governors have taken note of everyone's comments and suggestions. We thank you for taking the time to complete this questionnaire.
