Nursery Consultation

The Governing Body are considering opening the nursery all week instead of 5 mornings and 2 afternoons per week. Children are currently entitled to 5 free sessions per week from the term following their third birthday and additional sessions can be paid for. The government are proposing an increase in this free entitlement from September 2017, but we have no further information as yet. Full days are always the most popular and we think this change to the opening hours would be beneficial and offer more flexibility to parents.
