End of Year programme

We will have dates finalised for the busy end of year programme very soon! One of our aims in response to parent questionnaires was to make transition to new classes smoother for our children. Therefore we aim to increase the amount of time pupils spend in their new class before the end of the year so that our children can be more familiar with their new surroundings, teachers and teaching assistants when they return after the summer break. New Entrance

We have been developing the school's safety procedures across the year. Staff and parents have raised concern regarding the school car park being easily accessible from the playground. In addition, our school gate and entrance to the playground is open and accessible throughout the school day meaning that visitors must cross the yard to get to Early Years or go to the school's main entrance. As communicated previously, we have plans to create new walkway entrance to school to divide the playground and the car park and create a new entrance to the main entrance to school. This will guide visitors between drop off and collection time to the main entrance without having to cross the school yard and we will be

able to lock the playground gates between these times. Arrangements for drop off and collection will not change. Parents, carers and pupils will still be able to access the playground before and after to drop off and collect. Building work will take place during half term and should be fully complete by the end of the first week back. Thank you for your continued support.
