**PUPIL SAFETY**

Pupils safety is very important to us. As we do each half term, we have revisited our 'pupil safety quiz' this week with pupils across the school and staff have revisited procedures to ensure all staff are fully aware of expectations and systems. Staff are trained annually and so far this year all staff have taken part in safeguarding/child protection and online safety training led by the Local Authority. **The school's Designated Senior Person (DSP) and Online Safety Leader: Mr Robson** and the school's **Deputy DSPs are: Mrs McManus and Miss Wilford**. The school's nominated Safeguarding Governor is **Mr Blenkharn**. Please speak to us if you have any concerns regarding any matters. Thank you for your continued support.

**REMEMBRANCE SERVICE**

We would like to invite families to our Remembrance Day Service in school on **Friday 10th November**. The service will begin at **9.10am** and will be followed by an opportunity for families to stay for tea and coffee and visit an exhibition of pupils' work from our whole school WW1 topic. Please come along and join us in our service.

**PARENT CONSULTATIONS AND INFORMATION EVENING**

Autumn Term parent consultations will take place on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> November. This will be an opportunity for parents and carers to speak to their child's class teacher and look at work in books. We request that Year 6 pupils attend the consultation alongside their parents/carers. Unfortunately, we will not have the facility on this occasion to supervise younger children. Please can we request that parents make alternative arrangements for child care. Thank you for your support with this. As explained previously, there will be an exhibition in the school hall of useful materials and services. NYCC Catering, Road Safety, School Nurse (Healthy Child Team), Prevention (Colburn Children's Centre) will all have a stall. As a school, we will also display materials for parents relating to aspects of

learning in school and school administration such as help with school money and how to 'login'. We hope that parents find this useful.

**SCHOOL MONEY PAYMENTS**

We hope that by now most parents are up and running with School Money and are able to pay for lunches, drinks, Out of School Club and School Trips etc. online. Lunches taken are entered daily and the O.O.S.C. register is updated on a Monday showing sessions taken for the previous week. You will have noticed that e-mails are generated when there is an outstanding balance to pay for lunches or O.O.S.C. – parents are also able to login at anytime to check what is owed or what credit is remaining.

In preparation for our possible move to become part of the Dales Academies Trust and now that we are up and running with the School Money system we would like to make a request that **from January 2018 payment is made in advance for lunches**. Payment can be made weekly, or, a larger amount can be added as a credit but we ask that there is always sufficient credit on your child's account to cover lunches to be taken the following week. If for any reason your child is off school they will not be charged for that day and a £2.10 credit will carry forward. With regard to O.O.S.C. payment should be made in advance where possible, but we do understand that sometimes parents book children in at short notice, and also some bills are settled via child-care vouchers so there will be some flexibility with this. We do however ask that if you receive an e-mail with details of an outstanding balance that this is settled as soon as possible.

Please do use the opportunity at our Parent Information Evening on Thursday to speak to Mrs Banks if you are unable to login or have any other questions.

### CLASS 4:

### **CLASS 3:**

The children have had a very productive first week back. They have completed some amazing work in Maths relating to our new topic which focusses on multiplication and division. A list of key vocabulary that we will be learning during this topic has been sent home today. Please keep practising times tables at home 😊 As we are leading up to Remembrance Day, we have decided to carry on with our topic of War until the end of next week so that we can think about Remembrance. We will also be discussing who our heroes are. The children will need their outdoor PE kits for next week.

### **CLASS 2:**

The children have worked incredibly hard this week in Maths. They have been solving problems through practical activities using the outside area. In English we have been looking at Katie Morag and preparing to write a character profile. The children have used some exciting adjectives to describe characters from the story and have presented their work well. In RE we have been looking at heroes. The children have discussed people they consider to be heroes and who their heroes are. These range from Captain Underpants to Martin Luther King, which was great for discussion when comparing.

Next week the children will be bringing home scripts for our Christmas performance, Busy Busy Bethlehem to ensure they have plenty of time to practise. We will also continue with our work on heroes and Katie Morag.

### **EARLY YEARS:**

This week the children have really enjoyed learning all about bonfire night; they were fascinated by the story of Guy Fawkes and some of the children created Guy Fawkes wanted posters. The children enjoyed opportunities to create firework paintings both indoors and outdoors and some even designed their own firework! In Maths the children have been learning about money, they were able to extend this learning in the 'bonfire night food stall' role play area. Reception children enjoyed their first PE lesson this week with Mrs Little. She said their behaviour was excellent and all children could get changed independently, well done! Next week we will be reflecting on Remembrance on the lead up to Remembrance Sunday.
