ONLINE SAFETY MESSAGE



You may be aware of an app called Musical.ly that many children across the country are using at the moment. However, there has been concern that if privacy settings are not secure, children could be at risk. Parents and carers may want to check that privacy settings are secure if children are using this app.

TIPS

Blocking a user

If your child is receiving unwanted messages or comments, they can block the user on the app. You can block a user by going to their profile and selecting the icon with three dots on the right hand corner and then choosing 'block this user'.

Reporting inappropriate content

If your child comes across any content that is not appropriate they can press the icon with three dots on the side of the screen and select 'report abuse' from the list of options.
