CLASS 4: The children have completed their final drafts of their stories based on an image this week; they are fantastic! Next week, we will be looking at our new class novel 'King of the Cloud Forest' by Michael Morpurgo, linked to this half term's Geography topic: mountains.

CLASS 3: The children have completed some very complex Maths tasks this week which have been a great challenge. We have introduced our new class text 'The Boy with the Bronze Axe' which links to our topic of the Bronze Age. The children had some interesting ideas about the story using key words only to make inferences.

CLASS 2. The children have written some imaginative hidden chapters from The Three Little Pigs, next week we will be writing a new version of the story. In Maths we are moving onto a unit of time. Please practise telling the time to o clock and half past (Y1) and quarter to and past (Y2) at home and when out and about. We will be observing our seeds over the next week and recording our observations in a seed diary as part of our Science topic.

EARLY YEARS:

We are looking forward to our visit to Darlington Railway Museum on Monday. Nursery children who are in on Monday morning please wear a school jumper and wear a warm coat.

In Maths most Nursery children will be counting and comparing amounts and working on 2 and squares, and others will be continuing to estimate and count different objects and amounts. Please encourage estimation at home where you can. Literacy work will follow on from the visit and also The Train Ride book. The children are really enjoying the rhythm in the words from the story and are joining in well with the repetitive text. Please play any rhyming activities at home where your child has to continue the rhyming string. Eg bat, cat, fat, etc. Cot, dot, spot, etc. Thank you!
