CLASS 4: We are really excited and looking forward to our visit to East Barnby next week. On our return, we will be completing recounts and persuasive writing to encourage other young people to go. In Maths we are continuing to look at the place value of numbers to 1 million. As the children will be away for most of next week, please complete I Can Do Maths only for homework. This will be marked together next Friday so we can address any misconceptions and look at any new concepts.

CLASS 3: The children have been learning about the features of a diary entry this week and completed some lovely writing. We are all excited about our trip to Beamish and will be writing recounts about it next week. In Maths the children have been superstars when counting in multiples this week. Keep practising at home please. Next week we will be continuing our work on place value. The children have designed propaganda posters this week and will be using a green screen to take photos next week. If possible, can children bring in any clothes/props that they will need for their poster. Thank you. We have been so impressed with the effort the children have put into their homework this week. Well done. Keep up the hard work!

CLASS 2: This week we have worked really hard on our hand writing and story writing skills. The children have started their war time writing based on the story 'The Lion and the Unicorn' and writing in the style of author Shirley Hughes. In Maths we have been working on number and place value, discussing greater than, less than and equal to. The children have learnt some actions to go with this to help them with their decision making. A big 'well done' to all children for practising their spellings this week. They were very tricky! Next week, we will continue with our story writing and looking at designing a war time medal. On Monday we will be looking at 'a parcel from home' on our trip to Beamish..

EARLY YEARS: This week in Early Years the children have really enjoyed talking about their family and decorating their family

photos for the display. The children have also learned more about how to access the resources in the room and have experimented with colour mixing. I am so happy with how the children have settled in and how they are following the school rules. I look forward to seeing parents/carers at next week's meetings where we can share how to best meet each child's individual needs.
