**SPORT RELIEF (17<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup> MARCH)**



Throughout next week there will be various sporting activities taking place with a culmination next Friday where all pupils can come into school wearing their sports kit. Sport Relief has helped to treat over 900,000 people across Africa with anti-malarial drugs, it has helped over 3.4 million people in Africa by funding maternal, neonatal and child health care and helped more than 50,000 people in the UK living with a mental health problem. Next week, alongside the sport and fundraising, pupils will be learning about some of the problems faced by others locally, nationally and internationally. We are asking the children to bring in a donation of £1 on Friday to raise money for Sport Relief.





**CLASS 4:** We will be preparing for the debate next week by considering the question: Is Social Media a danger to children? We will look at persuasive devices and have a go at writing our own persuasive argument. In Maths we will be looking at measurement, including converting measures. **CLASS 3:**

It has been assessment week in Class 3 this week. We are really proud of how hard the children have worked – well done Class 3. In Science we have planned and enjoyed carrying out an experiment. We can now talk about friction and the affect it has on objects. Next week our Science topic will focus on magnets. In English we will be completing our poetry topic and moving on to focus on the use of inverted commas in our writing. In Maths next week we will be dividing numbers by 10 and 100 and comparing numbers. We will be having PE on Wednesday next week. Next week we will be working on writing a story about London based on what we have been learning through the class topic. In Maths we will be looking at different aspects of measurement. On Friday we will be taking part in various activities for Sport Relief in addition to our normal PE sessions. Please could all children have suitable outdoor PE kit. The 'I can do maths' books have arrived and will be handed out this week. Please accept my apologies for the wait. SATs books will be handed out on Friday this week and are not expected back until Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> March.
