#### CLASS 4:

We have had another extremely busy and exciting week in Class 4. This week in Maths, the children have been interpreting and drawing line graphs, as well as starting a newspaper article based upon Beowolf in English. In topic, we have been analysing the decision of the Anglo-Saxons to establish a kingdom in Northumbria and have been comparing the digestive systems of different animals in science.

## CLASS 3:

Class three have had a great week. In English they have been designing information leaflets for outdoor games. They have super imaginative ideas - a lot of them involve mud! In maths we have been focusing on times tables. Our favourite part was definitely singing and dancing to times tables songs. In science we looked at the different functions of the digestive system. Some of us became doctors for the afternoon. Diagnosing problems with our digestive system for different symptoms. We even had chance to start rehearsing our Christmas songs. It won't be long before we are singing them at home! Thank you to those of you who had chance to visit our stay and read. The children really enjoyed the opportunity to share their books with you. We hope you enjoyed it too.

## CLASS 2:

This week we have been making 2D and 3D shapes in maths using cocktail sticks and marshmallows. The children enjoyed making these and were able to understand the properties of the shape they created. We have finished writing our fantasy stories this week and have focused on editing and improving our work in year 2. Year 1 have focused more on building sentences. It has been a positive week for writing for everyone. In art, we have created some fantastic 'Nina' ships as part of our Christopher Columbus topic. Next week we will begin rehearsing for the Christmas performance. Scripts will be coming home soon.

## EARLY YEARS

The children have really enjoyed learning about super heroes this week. Next week we will be look at real life heroes such as vets, nurses and police. We will have a visit from Seth and Daniels Mum who works for the dogs trust. She will talk to us about her role. In maths the children will begin to look at simple addition. This week we welcomed Leeds University student Georgia Hirst. She will be with us for 3 weeks and then will join us again for her final placement after Christmas. She will be involved in teaching the children over the next few weeks.
