If you experience any problems with the login process for SchoolMoney please do contact the office to resolve these.

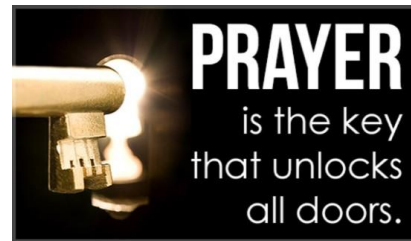

CLASS 4: We really enjoyed our visit to Beamish this week; it was excellent to be able to walk a day in a Victorian child's shoes. The children have started to write some wonderful recounts about their day. We had our first SOLE session this week focussed on "What are the Universal Children's Rights and Why are they important?" This provoked some great research and subsequent discussions; we hope to build on this with our second SOLE session his week.

Next week our writing will be focussed on a short film and we will be looking and showing rather than telling to describe characters and settings. Year 6 children will continue to solve problems linked to circles in Maths and Year 5 children will be calculating and comparing areas of rectangles and irregular shapes.

We will also be completing the PUMA and PIRA assessments for Maths and Reading.

CLASS 3: This week we have been looking at Children's Universal Rights' and how they link with British Values. The children have had some fantastic discussions around this and have shown excellent speaking and listening skills.

In Maths we are revisiting 'time' which is a really challenging area of Maths. Any practise that children could do at home would be fantastic. Regularly asking your children what the time is, is super practise.

The children are beginning to prepare themselves for sports week and have been engaging in different sporting activities throughout the week with our sports

coach Nathan and Mrs Marksby. The children are also making excellent progress with swimming. Confidence is growing with each session and staff at the pool have commented on how fantastic our children are!

CLASS 2: This week, the children have been making and tasting chai tea! They really enjoyed pounding the different herbs and ginger to make the chai flavour. We used coconut milk and sugar to give the sweet flavour and the tasting session resulted in most of the children liking it! They have been busy creating a story based on Michael Rosen's poem called Chocolate Cake. Perhaps, next week, we will be making chocolate cake! Thank you to everyone who has helped with the class fossil and India display. Your artefacts look lovely.

EARLY YEARS:

We have watched the changes of our caterpillars and cannot believe how fast they have grown in a week. We have searched for bugs in our outdoor area and even found some in the classroom. Next week we will be linking our activities to ladybirds. Reception children have begun to learn what respect means and how we can show respect.
