CLASS 4: This week, we have enjoyed completing our written arguments for whether homework is a waste of time and Year 6 prepared extremely well for the debating competition. They debated 'Is homework a waste of time?' along with 6 other schools. They represented our school brilliantly and made us very proud!

CLASS 3: This week we have been focussing on Growth Mindset and inspirational people that have shown Growth Mindset. The children have shared some fantastic ideas and discussed who inspires them, giving examples, such as Ellie Simmonds, Martin Luther King and Thomas Edison.

As part of our daily routine, the children have been taking part in 'Jump Start Johnny'. This short burst of exercise gets the children ready for the day and their coordination has really improved in a short space of time. It is great to hear that the children are doing this at home too ☺

The children will be bringing home invitations for our Christian Value Worship on Tuesday 28th March on Forgiveness. Hope to see you there!

CLASS 2: We will be beginning work on non-chronological reports in English this week. Our focus will be Growth Mindset. In Maths we will be finishing our work on measures and moving onto revision work on multiplication and division and how this links to finding fractions. In our topic we will be learning more about the brain and all of the amazing things it does. We would also like to thank everyone who came to watch our class worship this week. The children were fantastic at sharing their knowledge of forgiveness in the Bible and we are all very proud of them.

EARLY YEARS: This week we have continued our 'growth' topic by looking at Jack and The Beanstalk. We have written character descriptions, letters to the Giant from Jack and we have planted beans and cress seeds and are going to watch them grow. In Maths we have been ordering and practising writing teen numbers as well as using the beanstalk to count backwards to solve subtraction problems. Homework – To continue to practise reading the words on the tricky word sheet.

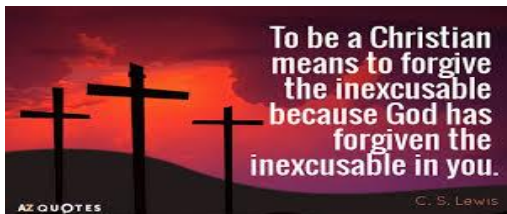
