CLASS 4: WOW!! What an amazing week we have had! The children in Class 4 should be so proud of everything they have achieved from climbing, beck scrambling, canoeing to making their own bed and organising their teams at meal times. They have been a credit to our school and have made me so proud! Next week we will be creating persuasive booklets to encourage other children to visit East Barnby and writing descriptions of some of the sights we passed. In Maths we will be looking at addition and subtraction, including written methods and problem solving.

CLASS 3:

The children had an amazing time on our trip to Beamish this week and have written super recounts all about their day. Next week we will be writing a diary entry as one of the characters from our class novel 'Friend or Foe' and in Maths we will be starting our new unit focussing on addition and subtraction. Unfortunately our green screen didn't arrive on time for this weeks lesson so we will be taking our photographs next week for our propaganda posters. The children chose their background picture this week and are very excited to add them to their posters.

CLASS 2: This week we took part in a work shop at Beamish, preparing a parcel for a soldier in the trenches. The children had the opportunity to buy products from the old shops to prepare the parcel. When we returned to school we discussed our trip and wrote a recount of our day. In Science we have been looking at seasonal changes. Next Wednesday afternoon, we plan to take the children on a 'welly walk' to observe the changes that we see in autumn. Could all children please bring their wellies on the day?

EARLY YEARS: This week the children have really enjoyed reading the story 'Farmer Duck' by Martin Waddell. They were

able to extend their learning selling produce in our 'farm shop' and looking after the animals in the 'vets'. The children have also enjoyed developing their writing skills through writing 'shopping lists' or 'pet information forms'. Some of the children even designed their own tractors using 2D shapes! Following the parents' meetings this week all parents' should now have provided the school with their email address to gain access to our online learning journey 'tapestry'. From next week you should now expect at least one observation per week for your child and also a weekly update on what the children have been learning and how you can support their learning at home. We would also love to see observations from home.
