In Maths the children have started to look at decimals and their relationship to fractions. Next week, we will be multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1000. Well done to the children who worked with Mrs Lees from All Saints school today, this will continue throughout the half term and our writing masterclasses will begin next Friday. Thank you to all the children who attended SATs club on Wednesday, this will also continue throughout the half term. Morning sessions on Tuesday and Thursday will begin next week from 8.30am.

**CLASS 3:** This week has been a very busy first week back. The children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in a Judaism workshop yesterday afternoon and have had a fantastic experience at the synagogue this

morning. Next week we will be writing a myth based on the planning that we have done this week. In Maths, we will be finishing our work on measure and moving on to fractions and decimals. P.E. will be on Tuesday and Friday next week.

**CLASS 2:** We have started looking at fractions this week and have used different fruits to model how fractions work. The children made a class fruit salad. The new homework grid has been glued in this week and I am looking forward to seeing all of the children's amazing work. Unfortunately the year one 'I can do maths' has still not arrived, therefore, I will send home alternative Maths. Year two children will bring home SAT's practise tonight. SAT's club will begin soon and further information will be sent home inviting parents to a short presentation on what to expect.

**EARLY YEARS:** The children have had lots of fun this week learning all about Chinese New Year! The children wrote shopping lists so that I could go and get all of the things that we needed to make noodles. We are looking forward to cooking and tasting the noodles today! Please look out for photos on Tapestry. Thank you for your voluntary food tasting and messy play contributions of £5 for the Spring Term. Next week, following on with the children's interests, we will be looking at families and linking this to the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. Where a family go on a hunt for a bear! If you have this book at home please read it with your child over the weekend.
