**COMMUNITY CELEBRATION WORSHIP**

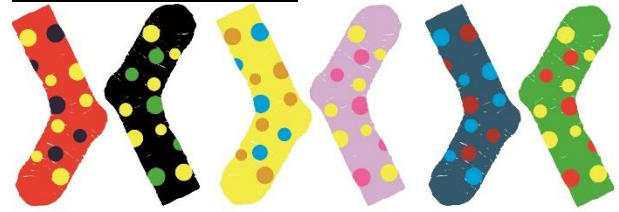
This morning's collective worship was lovely. Thank you to all of the family members who came into school to share it with us. It was lovely to see so many of you stay back for a cuppa and a chat.

**CLASS 4:** We have completed some descriptive writing focussed on Pandora's Box this week. Next week, we will be looking at editing and redrafting this, before publishing it in various ways. In Maths we have been recapping measures and converting between units. Our focus next week, will be angles and using a protractor. We will be busy making and baking for the Easter Fair next week and preparing for the Easter service and the final community worship of the term. **CLASS 3:** Class 3 have really enjoyed seeing some sunshine this week. Spring is on the way! We have completed our colour poems and worked on using inverted commas in our writing (speech marks of old!). In Maths we have continued working with decimals, dividing by ten and one hundred. We have had a go at creating our own branching data bases as part of our computing lessons. Not as easy as we first thought! Next week we are looking forward to Easter. We have the Easter enterprise to prepare for and also our Easter service. We look forward to seeing you there. Please practise lines over the weekend. The children have been given new spellings to be tested on the first week back after Easter. There will be no test next week.

**CLASS 2:** This week we have been looking closely at our class text "George's Marvellous Medicine". We have begun writing our own version of the story.

In Maths we have taken our learning outside for some practical measuring sessions. The children have shown good reasoning skills. Next week we will be creating some exciting gifts to sell at the Easter Enterprise Fair, alongside preparing for our Easter Service in church. As a grand finale to our London topic we will be watching Paddington 2. If you prefer that your child is withdrawn from this session please let me know. Homework and 'I can do Maths' are handed out on Friday and should be returned on Wednesday.

The children had a fab week this week learning all about Easter and making Easter nests on Tuesday. I hope they all enjoyed eating them at home! In Maths the Reception children are really beginning to get the hang of 3D shapes. A home learning task will be in their home learning books this week. Next week will be a very busy week with lots going on therefore there will be no PE. Please feel free to take home your child's PE kit for washing. I hope to see as many of you as possible at next week's events.
