### CLASS 4:

In Maths this week we have been focussing on completing calculations using short division. Next week, we will move onto long division. We will complete our hot write for recounts in English and start our new 'Slam poetry' topic.

CLASS 3: This week we have been focussing on using different representations to support multiplication and division calculations. This has allowed the children to challenge themselves further in Maths ☺

In Geography we have been looking at the difference between weather and climate. The children's homework in relation to this was superb!

As you may be aware we have a new selection of books in Class 3 which has really inspired the children to read more. Please continue where possible to encourage and support reading at home.

Finally, next week we will begin our preparations for Christmas, incorporating a Christmas theme into our learning.

CLASS 2: Next week we will be looking at enterprise activities linked to the Christmas Fair. We will be using a budget to create Christmas decorations and pricing up the cost of materials needed to paint a plant pot and plant a bulb. Our writing will also be focussed on our enterprise project; we will be following and writing instructions. We have started rehearsals for the Christmas performance; the children have been great so far. Please continue to practise lines, including expression, at home to help. Thank you ☺

EARLY YEARS: This week we have begun sorting materials. We are looking at objects and deciding whether they are made from paper, wood, metal or plastic. Reception children have also been working on soft, hard, smooth and bumpy/rough to describe different materials.

Next week we will be making preparations for the Christmas Fair and incorporating Maths, Literacy and Art work into this. We will continue to learn words to our Christmas songs. We will be opening a role play shop!
