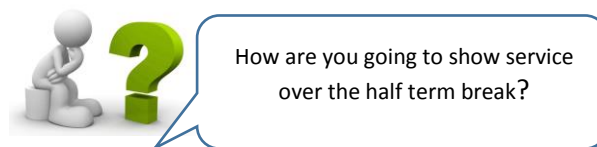

THE BIG WEEKLY QUESTION...



CLASS 2, 3 AND 4

Can Do maths books will be collected in this week and replaced with other maths homework after half term for the rest of the Summer term. Thank you for all of the hard work you have done with your children at home.

CLASS 4: We put a more sinister twist on the big write this week in class 4. Our classroom was shaped into an evil, dungeon-like room to get us in the mood for our dark prince and princess story. Everyone came up with fantastic vocabulary and created amazing pieces of work! Our research skills have also been put to the test, looking into Ancient Greece. Everyone has had great fun working together to make inferences about what life may have been like back then. Class 4 will be doing Art with Mrs Donoghue during the first week back. We will be linking Art to the Ancient Greeks. Hope you all have a lovely half term week.

CLASS 3: Class three had a very different start to the week with the classroom being transformed into Croft Castle. They were assigned the important task of writing a newspaper report for the wedding of the new Duke and Duchess of Sussex. We had a fun morning using reporter note books to research and of course ended the day with a slice of lemon and elderflower cake! In maths we have been tackling the tricky topic of time. We have been so impressed with how well everyone has persevered - well done. Our science topic asked children to think about environmental changes and the impact these have on animals. The children showed great insight and came up with ways we can make a difference. The children are enjoying completing the Archbishop Youth Trust Award activities. Please continue to complete as many challenges at home with a reflection of the task. It was class three's turn to lead community worship on Wednesday morning. They read poems and prayers they had written themselves. A really lovely end to the half term. Have a lovely half term holiday.

CLASS 2: This week we have all been busy with our BIG WRITE. On Monday morning all of the children walked into a castle and created a fairy tale based on the royal wedding. We had some fantastic ideas, from knights with swords, witches with magic spells and Meghan turning into a frog. What fantastic imaginations. In maths the children have been working on multiplication and division word problems. When we return we will be looking at Geometry: position and direction. Miss Hirst will complete her teaching placement this week. The children and staff have really enjoyed having her in school and hope that she will come back in the future. PE after half term will be athletics and will be outdoors. Have a lovely week off!

EARLY YEARS: The children have really enjoyed reading little red riding hood this week and making wanted posters for the 'Big Bad Wolf'. Thank you to all the parents' who helped the children with walking to church on Wednesday. This is greatly appreciated. All children have some home learning ideas to take home which can be completed over the holidays. Children will be given extra books for over the holidays, please don't forget to read with your child as often as possible during the break. All children received a new library book this week. A reminder for new parents': children can choose a new library book every week to take home. This is a book to be shared with an adult (for example as a bedtime story) and intended for children to read themselves. Library books will be changed every Wednesday, if your child is not in school this day please come and chat to us and their book can be changed on an alternative day.
