We will be continuing to look at addition and subtraction involving reasoning and problem solving in Maths. We will be polishing our class worship next week in preparation for Thursday; we hope you liked your personalised scroll invitations and we look forward to seeing you all at 3pm on Thursday. As part of our art and topic work, the children will be creating life sized sculptures of soliders in the Christmas Truce on Friday. PE this week will be indoors.

The children will also start to felt some poppies this week. Please can all children bring in a hand towel and a plastic bag as it will get wet with water and washing up liquid. Also please

advise Mrs McManus of any sensitivities to washing up liquid and non-latex gloves. Thank you!

**CLASS 3:** Class 3 have had a super week this week. They have thoroughly enjoyed working with Miss Jones and have written some super diary entries in the role of a character from our class text. They will continue to improve them next week for their final draft. In Maths the children have worked extremely hard to grasp the concept of rounding and reading Roman Numerals this week. We will be working on our mental methods and written calculations for addition and subtraction next week.

**CLASS 2:** What a super week in class 2. The children took part in their first Christian Value worship this week (The Thankful Coat). All of the children did a great job.

Our welly walk was a success and we collected some fantastic autumn leaves for the display in class. We have also created a pictogram to show what we found.

Next week we will be looking at adding and subtracting in multiples of ten in Maths and writing war time poetry through our senses in English. The new class text we will be looking at is 'where the poppies now grow' by Hilary Robinson and Martin Impey.
