Staff have spoken to pupils today and reminded them about safety on the school grounds after school. Please can I remind parents and carers that their child/children should always be in sight and hearing distance of them whilst on the school grounds and to intervene if there are any concerns. **Pupils are not allowed around the rear of school** and should always be playing in a **safe and positive manner**. We have staff on duty at playtimes and lunchtimes to ensure that the rear of the school remains out of bounds and to promote safe play however, we cannot provide this level of support to protect children from any safety issues that may arise after we have handed them over to their parents and carers. Of course, parents and carers are welcome to remain on the school grounds after they have collected their children as it is an opportunity to meet with friends and members of the school community. Please support the school to ensure that pupils are always safe when using the school grounds.

**CLASS 4:** We will be starting our English topic on recounts next week by looking at a variety of different recounts and analysing their features. In Maths, we will be continuing to look at calculations and formal written methods. We will also begin to rehearse the Christmas play, which the children are very excited about. ☺

**CLASS 3:** We will be finishing off our English topic on instructions and explanations this week and completing our Out Write. In Maths we will be continuing with multiplication and division and using different methods to work out calculations. We will also be working with class 4 on the Christmas performance.

**CLASS 2:** We will be beginning our topic on fantasy stories in English. Our focus text will be “The Magic Bed” by John Burningham. In Maths we are looking at addition and subtraction. The children will be given some key maths facts to practise each week. Although they may seem simple the key objective will be fast recall without the use of fingers or counting. Our PE days are Thursday and Friday. As we will be covering dance and gymnastic units the children do not need to bring trainers or outdoor PE kit.

**EARLY YEARS:**

We have begun our Nursery rhymes theme with Humpty Dumpty. What a great week – egg experiments, making egg sandwiches, making Humpty Dumpty and writing instructions on how to make egg sandwiches as well as beginning to discuss

healthy eating. Wow! Next week is World Nursery Rhyme week. We will be learning "Dr Foster", "It's Raining, It's Pouring" and "Mary Mary". Our activities will link to these rhymes. Please continue to share reading books and library books at home. Thank you. Reception children will be getting new sounds again next week.
