How can you serve others in your community?

CLASS 4: This week the children have been learning about forces in Science. They have learned who discovered gravity as well as conducting an investigation to determine whether the force of gravity exerted upon an object is affected by its mass. In English, Year 5 have been working towards writing an information text about Gibbons and have been investigating 3D shape and angles in Maths. The Year 6s have been working hard in preparation for their upcoming SATS; completing more practice papers and partaking in revision lessons. Next week, the children will continue to learn more about forces and will complete more investigations to discover how air resistance affects a parachute. On Wednesday next week, Class 4 will have PE. Please can the children ensure that they have their kits.

CLASS 3:

In maths this week we have been handling data. We can draw and answer questions about pictograms and have realised the importance of being accurate. In English class three were very excited to watch the whole of the short film 'Soar'. The ending was quite a surprise. Next week we will be writing a diary entry based on this film. We will be thinking carefully about our word and phrase choices. In music we have continued to learn about the pentatonic scale. We created a really tuneful glockenspiel and chime bar orchestra! Don't forget your swimming kit next Wednesday. In RE we are learning about why Jesus is an inspiration to Christians. Next week we will be thinking about the differences between a miracle and a magic trick. If any of the children would like to prepare a magic trick to show us please be ready to share on Thursday. Can do Maths marking will be going back to a Friday next week. Please have your books ready to mark on that day.

CLASS 2: This week the children have been thinking about growth mindset and famous Victorians that have shown this. They have looked at the life of Florence Nightingale and how she trained nurses, encouraging them to have a growth mindset also. The children have been looking at mass and volume in maths with lots of practical activities. Miss Hirst is well underway with her teaching and is doing a super job. On Tuesday next week the year 2 children will begin their first SATS paper. This will be reading. PE in class 2 is always on a Monday and Friday. Could all children please have their kit in school for these days. Finally – Spellings and I can

do Maths marking is on Friday. Please could all books be in school on this day. Thank you.

EARLY YEARS:

The children have had lots of fun this week planting beans and reading Jack and the Beanstalk. We can't wait to see our beans grow! The children have shown a real interest in football and ball games this week. Next week we will be reading the story 'Spinderella' by Julia Donaldson which is about spiders that likes to play football! Thank you for all of the recent observations on tapestry, we love to see what the children get up to at home. Recently, lots of children have been bringing toys from home into school. We ask for no toys from home to be brought into school as this can cause problems among children and they often end up lost. Do however feel free to allow your child to bring in books to read, things they have made or leaflets from places they have visited at the weekend.
