**DURHAM TRIP**

Watch out for a letter explaining our forthcoming visit to Durham Cathedral for pupils in Y1 to Y6! The trip costs **£9** per child and the school will pay the additional **£5**. As part of the visit, pupils will learn about our three Saints: St Bede, St Cuthbert and St Aidan.

**CLASS 4:** This week we have been investigating statistics in Y6 Maths, the children have created some very accurate line graphs. Year 5 have been using their problem solving skills to find missing sides and angles of 2d shapes. We have completed some imaginative poetry about chimney sweeps and our non-chronological reports based on Queen Victoria are very informative.

We are looking forward to our trip to Beamish next Tuesday, our writing next week will be a recount and letters of thanks to the staff.

Next week will hold our first SOLE session; this is a self-organised learning environment and will focus on Universal Children's Rights.

**CLASS 3:** This week in Maths we are revisiting measurement. The children have been working hard to compare and calculate units of measure including length, mass and capacity. We are showing super progress in swimming so far. The children are improving each week, show real determination to learn and are constantly encouraging one another.

The "stay for a story" coffee morning is approaching and the children will be making some invites to bring home. You will receive further details of this soon. The children are excited to be organising this event and hope to see as many of you there as possible ☺

**CLASS 2:** The children have had a great deal of fun finding out about Indian clothing. We have been reading poetry by Michael Rosen, in particular, the poetry about his son, Eddie. They are very funny poems and the children have enjoyed listening to them and writing their own 'Eddie' poetry. If you have any artefacts that relate to our topic of India, we would love to make a class display of them!

### EARLY YEARS:

What an exciting week! We have begun our minibeast theme by reading the story of the very hungry caterpillar and the children have been sequencing pictures, retelling the story and writing the story. We have also had a special delivery of caterpillars which we will be observing over the coming weeks. In Maths Reception have been estimating and measuring using cm. Nursery children have been working on naming shapes and doing lots of counting. If you still have one of our travelling teddies at home please return it next week. Thank you!
